Many of these developed in isolation from the mainland, over terrain ranging from woodlands and grasslands to chapparal and coastal sage scrub. Fourteen of the islands' plants are federally listed as threatened or endangered species. Join us to get acquainted with some interesting and rare plants found on our own Channel Islands.
